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## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

#### **STRs**

FMU received 6,144 STRs during the third quarter of the year 2022.

#### **MAJOR SECTORS**

Major reporting Sectors include Banks (4,827 STRs) and Exchange Companies (859).

#### **CTRS**

1,095,570 CTRs have been received during the third quarter (July-Sep) of the year 2022.

#### REPORTING DISTRICTS

Top three STR reporting districts (during the third quarter of 2022) are Karachi, Lahore, and Islamabad with 1,370, 811 and 615 reported STRs, respectively.

#### **OFFENCES**

Top 3 Offences during third quarter (Jul-Sep) of the year 2022, in terms of number of disseminated Financial Intelligences, are Tax Crimes, Terrorism Financing and Hawala and Hundi and respectively.

#### **STRATEGIC ANALYSIS**

During the third quarter of 2022, FMU disseminated 8 Strategic Analysis.





Financial Monitoring Unit known as FMU, is the financial intelligence unit of Pakistan. Its core functions are to receive STRs and CTRs, their analysis and dissemination.

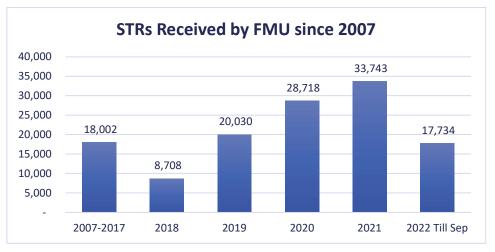
The STRs and CTRs are filed by financial institutions and designated non-financial businesses and professions.



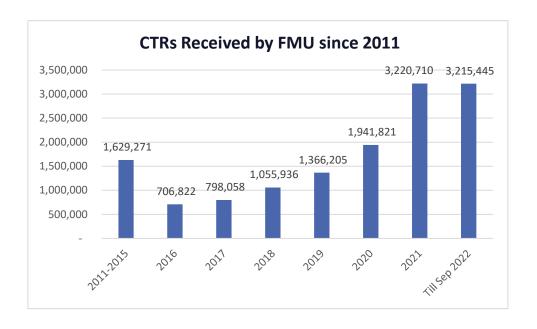
#### STRATEGIC ANALYSIS

# CTRs RECEIVED BY FMU SINCE 2011



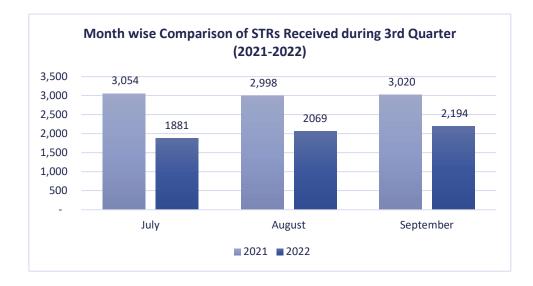
## MONTH WISE STRS RECEIVED

#### **Awareness Sessions**

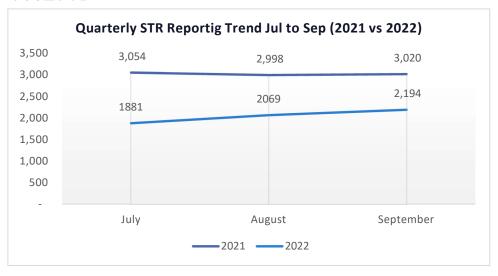
During third quarter of 2022 FMU organized two webinars for designated non-financial businesses and professions.



#### **Compliance Meetings**

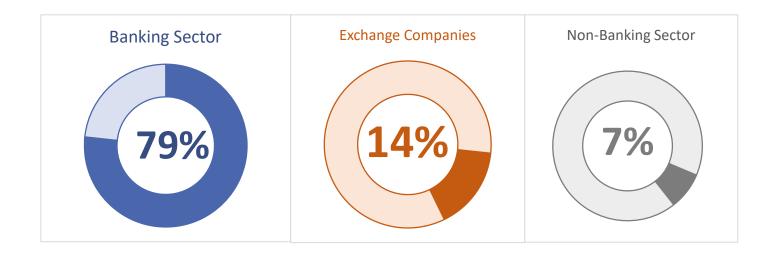
During the period of Jul to Sep 2022, goAML taskforce and Compliance team conducted two feedback and compliance meetings with its reporting entities.

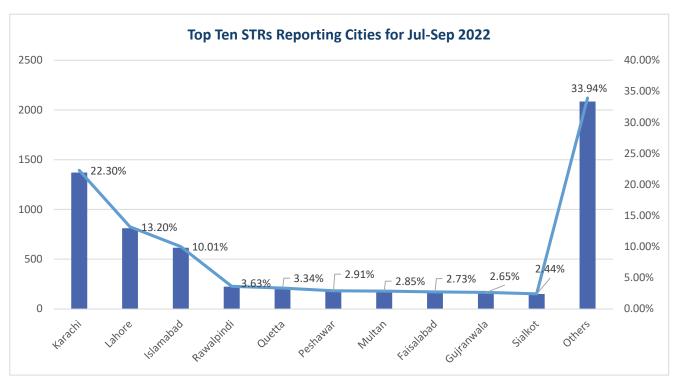

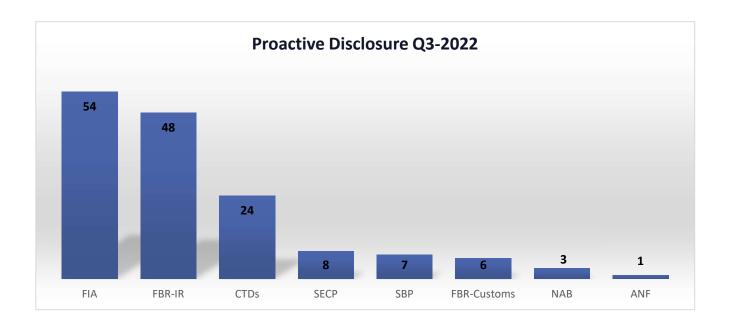

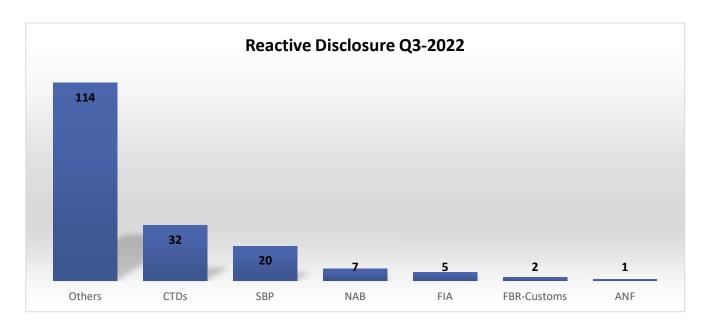

### **Capacity Building**



#### **Awareness Sessions**

During the month of August 2022, FMU organized two Zoom based webinars for two different sectors of Designated Non-Financial Businesses and Professions (DNFBPs). These webinars were conducted for real estate sector and accountants which were attended by 315 participants. During last year, FMU onboarded different sectors of DNFBPs and has taken focused efforts for outreach to its new reporting sectors to enhance their understand and knowledge.

#### **Compliance meetings**

In month of July 2022, FMU also conducted two feedback and compliance meetings. One of them was with an exchange company while the other one was with private commercial bank. In these meetings, feedback was provided by highlighting major issues on previously reported STRs, and recommendations were provided thereof.



### **Strategic Analysis**

Strategic Analysis at FMU is conducted to identify the underlying patterns and trends to draw conclusions for the prevention of money laundering, financing of terrorism and other serious offences, and to provide input for policy formulation and for setting operational priorities. During third quarter of 2022, FMU conducted 8 different strategic analysis, details of which are as under:
